He has assisted clients operating in the financial services industry in respect of the largest cartel investigation so far run by the Competition Commission of Mauritius

Shrivani regularly assists clients in all aspects of revenue law litigation, up to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council.

Shrivani has also appeared as junior counsel in a number of complex cross-border litigation matters and has appeared before arbitral tribunals set up under the ICC Rules and the MARC Rules. He has also been involved in a number of applications in respect of foreign arbitral awards and incidental applications in aid of international arbitration.

In terms of his employment law experience, Shrivani has assisted clients in respect of cross-border retrenchment plans and has appeared in some of the largest severance allowance claims before the Industrial Court. He has successfully appeared for employers in labour disputes against trade unions and regularly advises clients in respect of employment contracts, discrimination claims, employment policies and pension entitlement of employees.
